Nicola Hands studied oboe and cor anglais at the Royal Academy of Music after graduating in languages from Cambridge University. At the RAM she played principal

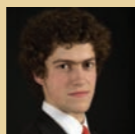

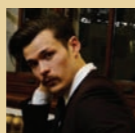


Wednesday 26th August

music. They are founded and directed by John Holland-Avery who currently holds a postgraduate scholarship to study voice at the Royal Northern College of Music.

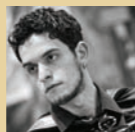


Wednesday 2nd September
