## Local History

Suitable for: Key Stage 1&2

Max children per session: 30

Max sessions per day: 3\*

**Aim:** To understand about significant historical events, people and artefacts in the Cathedral's history from 100AD-present, and how they relate to national history

**Children will do this by:**

- Uncovering the stories of 8 historical people and the events they were part of
- Deciphering the facts about 6 key artefacts
- Creating a timeline



**Key Vocabulary:** Artefact, Chronological order, National, Timeline, Roman, Saxon, Medieval, Tudor, Civil War, Stuarts, Modern

**What we provide:**

- Tablets (1 between 5)
- Timeline record cards
- 3D Artefacts and discovery packs

**School to provide:**

- Pencils
- Scissors
- Chairs and tables for group work (6 groups of 5)
- Projector and screen

**Before the session why not:**

- Introduce the key vocabulary
- Look at an example of a timeline

**After the session why not:**

- Make a display with your timeline cards and send us a photo
- Make extra cards for people, event and artefacts you have learnt about in class




**\*\*History:** Know and understand the history of these islands as a coherent, chronological narrative, from the earliest times to the present day: how people's lives have shaped this nation and how Britain has influenced and been influenced by the wider world

Gain historical perspective by placing their growing knowledge into different contexts, understanding the connections between local, regional, national and international history; between cultural, economic, military, political, religious and social history; and between short- and long-term timescales.

**Local History:** **KS1** Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality. **KS2** a study of an aspect of history or a site dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant in the locality.
