Restrictions to Access

Access will not be permitted to:

- Children under the age of 8 (children aged 8-17 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.)
- Anyone to be perceived to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

You should not climb if you:

- Suffer from vertigo or claustrophobia or are nervous of heights, steep spiral staircases, narrow passageways and high galleries.
- Are pregnant, suffer from heart disorders, or any medical condition or disability which might affect their own safety or the safety of others including breathing conditions

Covid-19

- Please use the hand sanitiser points
- All other COVID precautions are a matter of personal choice such as mask wearing and completing track and trace, however we would ask all visitors to act carefully and proportionately, to manage the risks to themselves and others

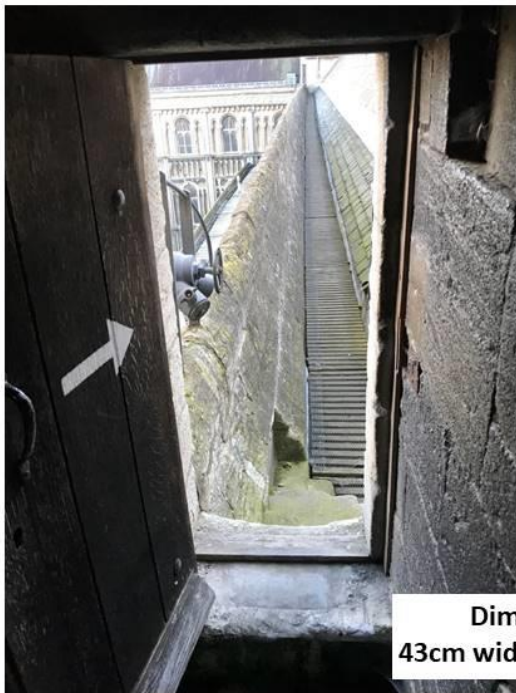
General Health and Safety Points

- Please view the photos (here) which give visitors examples of the sorts of hazards and restrictions
- Please wear closed heeled, flat shoes. No high-heels or flip flops
- Bags must be left at ground level – Cathedral Guides will show you where these can be stored. Small bags can be carried but these must be carried around the shoulders
- Decisions and instructions of the Cathedral Guides are final and must be followed without question at all times.

- Cameras should be secured via a strap, and are carried at owners own risk. Please ensure that if you are taking photos on your phone that you do not lean over the rails
- Both hands must be free
- Smoking is prohibited

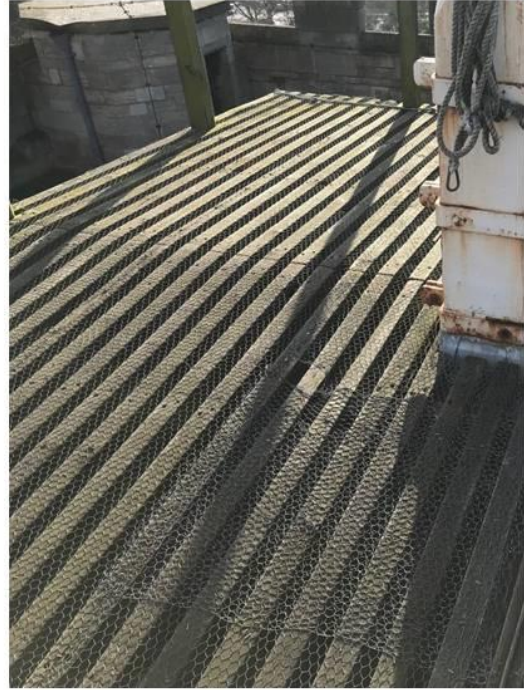
Dimensions:

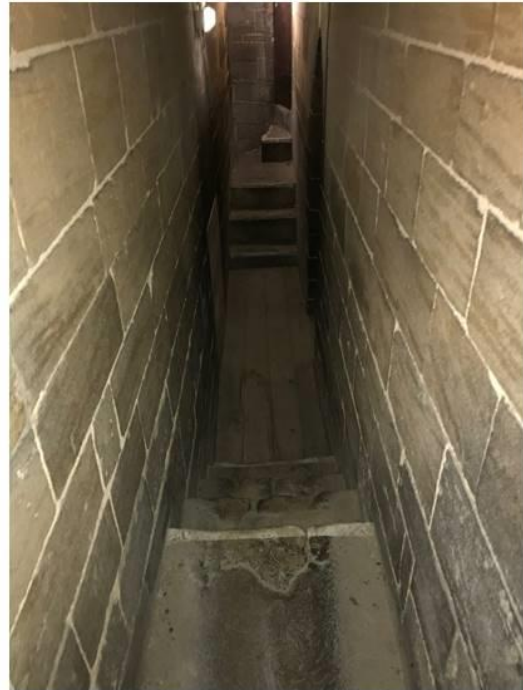
