Our aim is to support the development and preservation of Peterborough Cathedral, raising funds to secure its mission, ministry, and ancient fabric for generations to come.



A gift of £3,000 will support a boy or girl chorister for a year or £18,000 will fund a 6 year choristership in your name. Your support will not only sustain Cathedral music it will give talented young people the opportunity to learn and develop.

How Your Support Can Make a Difference

Cathedral Building, Furnishings, Precincts & Heritage

Peterborough Cathedral needs to spend £1.2 million per year on essential repairs and restoration. By leaving us a gift in your Will we can preserve the buildings and treasures of national and international significance for generations to come. Your support will help us maintain:

- The 900-year-old Cathedral building, with its unique thirteenth-century painted wooden ceiling.
- The Cathedral Precinct Walls, the oldest walls in the city, dating from the eleventh-century.
- The burial place of the first wife of Henry VIII, Queen Katharine of Aragon.
- The exquisite fifteenth-century fan vaulting in the New Building.
- The Hedda Stone, an Anglo-Saxon carving of national importance, dating from about 800 AD.



Cathedral Music and Choristers

Music is at the heart of Cathedral life, however, maintaining such choral excellence comes at a cost. Servicing the Cathedral's Music Department costs £225,000 annually. By leaving a gift to Music you will be helping to sustain the music of the Cathedral and giving talented young people the opportunity to learn and develop.

Peterborough Cathedral is proud to be part of the great English Choral Tradition, making world class music six days a week. The Cathedral Choir provides a remarkable educational opportunity for the 50 local boys and girls, aged 7 to 13 years old, who serve as choristers.

- Each chorister's musical education costs £3,000 per year and is entirely funded by donations.
- The choristers all attend the The King's (The Cathedral) School, which is a state-funded Academy. This is almost unique amongst Cathedral Choir Schools and ensures that any local child, regardless of their background, has the opportunity to be a chorister.
- Peterborough is a multicultural city, and the current choir comprises children of different faiths and backgrounds. The professional training they receive gives them a thorough grounding in the English Choral Tradition, as well as a more general understanding of music, self-discipline and experience of working in a team. The educational significance cannot be over-emphasised.

Community and Education

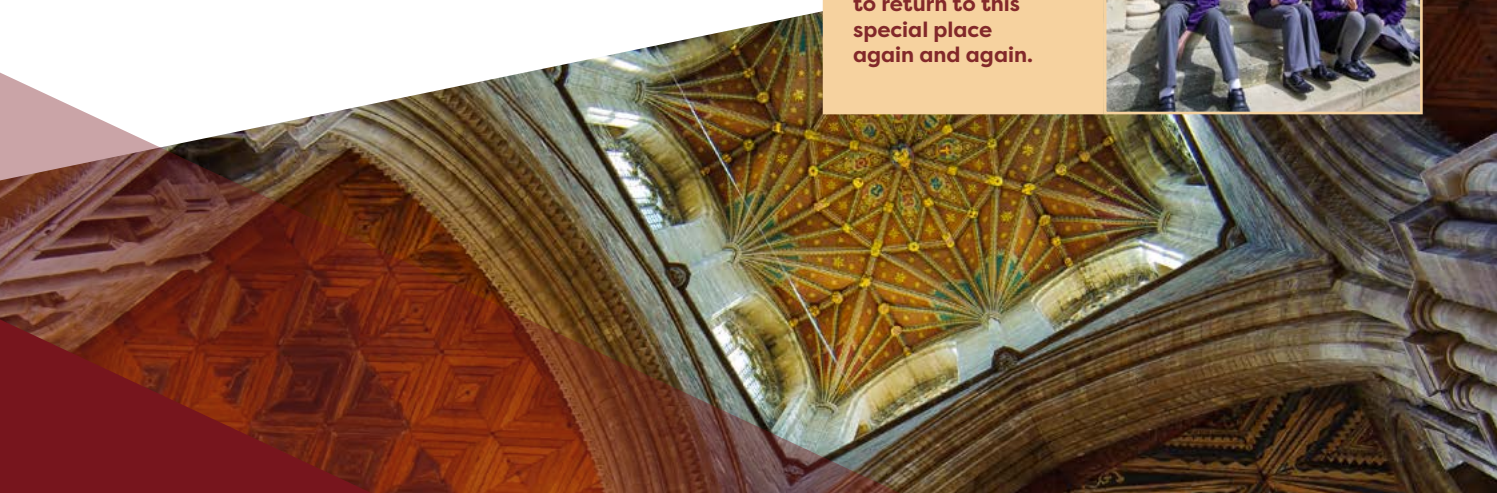
The Cathedral Visitor and Learning Centre opened in 2016 and has enabled us to engage more fully with visitors and the local community as never before. To encourage local people to use the Cathedral, we offer:

- State of the art education rooms where each year thousands of school children come to learn about the Cathedral and its religious, cultural and historic significance.
- Community facilities such as the Knights' Chamber and Almoner's Hall - unique spaces in the city centre which can be used for a variety of events and activities.
- Meeting spaces for a variety of charities and organisations such as the Armed Forces Veterans and faith discussion groups, as well as a venue for small exhibitions and performances.

We are also developing our work in helping to meet the needs of the homeless, elderly and vulnerable.

This allows us to be more flexible and allocate your gift to where it's most needed at the time, be that the fabric of the building, the Music Department or one of the many unexpected costs that the Cathedral faces each year.

Several solicitors have offered a free Will service to those who are planning to make a gift to Peterborough Cathedral. Your Will is an ideal way to show your support for this very special place. Whether you are passionate about the building, its music, education work or mission, your gift will enable us to support the development and preservation of Peterborough Cathedral for future generations.

What's more, if you choose to leave 10% of your estate to charities (of which the Cathedral Trust is one), **you will pay a reduced rate of inheritance tax for your entire estate (currently 36% rather than 40%).**
