Before the Service, the Dean Designate will take the following Declaration and Oaths as required by law in the presence of the Bishop, the Chapter and the College of Canons:

Preface

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

Declaration of Assent

I, Christopher Charles Dalliston, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by Canon.

The Oath of Allegiance

I, Christopher Charles Dalliston, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, her heirs and successors, according to law: So help me God.

The Oath of Canonical Obedience

I, Christopher Charles Dalliston, do swear by Almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Peterborough and his successors in all things lawful and honest: So help me God.

The Presentation

The Bishop of Newcastle addresses the Bishop of Peterborough:

Right Reverend Father in God, I present to you The Very Reverend Christopher Charles Dalliston, until now Dean of Newcastle that he may be Instituted and Installed as Dean of your Cathedral Church of St Peter, St Paul and St Andrew in Peterborough. We commend him to you with our love and prayers.

The Bishop says:

We greet you in the name of the Lord, and thank you for this presentation. Let the Mandate of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second be read before this congregation.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Christopher Charles Dalliston has been duly appointed Dean of this Cathedral Church, and has taken and subscribed to the Oaths and Declaration required by law.

Is it your will that he be Instituted and Installed into the Deanery of this Cathedral Church?

Will you therefore uphold him in your prayers and, in so far as you are able, share with him in working for the Kingdom of God in the world?

All: With God's help we will.

Let us therefore open our hearts and minds to the word of God, praying for all God's people in their vocation and ministry, and especially for Christopher, Michelle and their family.

*The Dean designate kneels before the Bishop who reads The Letter of Institution.
The Dean remains kneeling as the Canons Residentiary clothe him with his cope.
The Bishop then says:*

Let us pray that God will bless Chris in this office and ministry
to which he has been called and instituted.

A short silence is kept before the Bishop continues:

God, who has bestowed upon his people many excellent gifts,
pour his blessing upon you,
stir up in you the gifts of his grace,
and sustain you in all your work in his name.

All: Amen.

Act of Welcome and Commitment

The Dean stands and the Bishop welcomes him.

Three representatives from the Cathedral, the Diocese and the city welcome the new Dean using the three strands from the Cathedral's mission and development plan: promoting wonder, celebrating faith and taking risks in the service of Christ.

Promoting wonder

Miriam Sellick, on behalf of the cathedral congregation, addresses the Dean:

Mr Dean, we welcome you, and invite you to join us
in proclaiming the Word of God in this cathedral church and beyond.
Will you lead us and help us
to see beyond the splendour of this building
to the glory of God's kingdom?
Will you be diligent in studying God's Word,
modelling your life upon it, and growing daily in faith and obedience?

The Dean: With God's help I will.

The Dean addresses the congregation:

Will you, the people of God, read the Scriptures faithfully,
be open to God's living word for you,
and allow its truth to shape your vocation and ministry,
drawing you ever closer to one another in him?

All: With God's help, we will.

Celebrating Faith

Peter Lawson, Chair of the Peterborough Cathedral Development Trust, welcomes the new Dean on behalf of the diocese

Chris, we welcome you, and invite you to join us
in calling others to be disciples of Christ.
Will you give yourself wholly in the service of the Gospel,
that all people may come to know that Jesus is Lord?

The Installation

The Chapter join the Dean, Canon Black bearing a copy of the Holy Bible.

The Dean says to the acting Precentor:

Canon Alban Jones, I present to you a Mandate
from the Bishop of Peterborough
for my Installation and Induction into the Deanery
of this Cathedral Church.

The acting Precentor hands the Mandate to the Registrar and says:

Let the Declaration of the Dean first be made and subscribed
according to the Statutes of this Cathedral Church.

Laying his hand on the Bible, the Dean reads:

The Declaration

I, Christopher Charles Dalliston, who have been appointed Dean, do solemnly declare that I will to the best of my ability exercise authority on behalf of the Chapter in this Cathedral Church. I will serve the Chapter, the Foundation and congregation by exercising the ministry laid upon me with openness to the Spirit of God, with zeal for the Christian gospel and with reverence to all who share in the worship and mission of this Cathedral Church, in obedience to its Constitution and Statutes and in the faith of Jesus Christ to the glory of God.

The Dean signs the Declaration.

During the following anthem the Cathedral Chapter leads the Dean to his stall.

The acting Precentor takes the Dean by the hand and places him in his stall, saying:

By virtue of this Mandate I install you into the seat assigned to your dignity, and do effectually induct you into the real, actual and corporal possession of your Office, with all its rights, members and appurtenances. The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in from this time forth and for evermore.

All: Amen.

The Dean kneels in his stall and the acting Precentor says:

Bless, O Lord, your servant Christopher
now Installed as Dean of this Cathedral Church.
May the boldness of your Spirit empower him,
may the gentleness of your Spirit lead him,
may the gifts of your Spirit equip him to worship you
and serve your people to the glory of your name.

All: Amen.

All: Bring in your Kingdom.

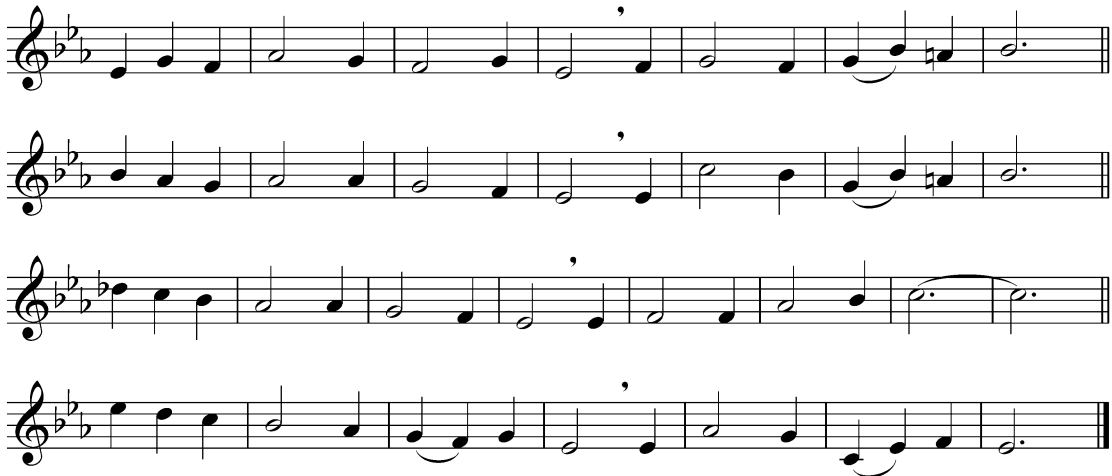
Looking, therefore, for the coming of your Kingdom,
