The Acting Precentor says

Right Reverend Father in God, I present The Reverend Sarah Brown to be collated and installed as a Residentiary Canon of your Cathedral.

The Bishop says

Canons of our Cathedral Church have a responsibility to support the life of prayer of the Cathedral, both in their private devotions and in their corporate acts of worship. They are called also to promote its mission in the diocese, and shall discharge such duties as may be assigned to them by the Chapter. Are you willing to take this responsibility?

I am.

Will you be reverent and faithful in the worship of Almighty God in this place?

With God's help, I will.

Will you do all in your power to further God's mission through the work of this Cathedral community?

With God's help, I will.

The Bishop reads the Deed of Collation, saying as he hands the Deed to Canon Brown

Accept this responsibility, and may Almighty God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, give you grace to bear it.

The Bishop addresses Canon Brown

I now ask you to make the Declaration prescribed by the Statutes of our Cathedral Church.

Laying a hand upon the Bible, Canon Brown says

I, Sarah Brown, who have been appointed a *Residentiary Canon* do solemnly declare that I will serve the Chapter, the foundation and congregation by exercising the ministry laid upon me with openness to the Spirit of God, with zeal for the Christian Gospel, and with reverence to all who share in the worship and mission of this Cathedral Church, in obedience to its Constitution and Statutes, and in the faith of Jesus Christ and to the glory of God.

The Bishop says

Mr Dean, having duly appointed Sarah Brown as Residentiary Canon of our Cathedral Church, I ask you to receive, robe and install her.

The Dean replies

I will gladly do so.

The new Canon is vested with a Chapter cope.

Stand as the Dean leads Canon Brown to her stall, and says

I, Christopher Dalliston, Dean of this Cathedral Church, do receive you and do assign you a stall in the Quire.

The Lord bless you and keep you,

All: and make his face to shine upon you.

The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in,

All: from this time forth and for ever more. Amen.

Read by The Dean of Peterborough

But as for you, teach what is consistent with sound doctrine. Tell the older men to be temperate, serious, prudent, and sound in faith, in love, and in endurance.

Likewise, tell the older women to be reverent in behaviour, not to be slanderers or slaves to drink; they are to teach what is good, so that they may encourage the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, to be self-controlled, chaste, good managers of the household, kind, being submissive to their husbands, so that the word of God may not be discredited.

Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled. Show yourself in all respects a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, gravity, and sound speech that cannot be censured; then any opponent will be put to shame, having nothing evil to say of us.

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.
